POWER PLANT Commissioing UPDATE

For more information please visit our website www. levenseat.co.uk/energyfrom-waste/ We have now moved into the next stage of the commissioning journey and as part of the phased commissioning programme the Levenseat Power Plant has achieved operational takeover.

The hand-over to Levenseat comes after M&W, the plant's engineering, procurement and construction (EPC) contractor, completed a 14 day trial to demonstrate the plant's operability.

The next stage for the plant will be to run 60 days of performance trials to demonstrate the facility's reliability and to test various parameters relating to technical performance.

The Levenseat facility is unique to Scotland due to its front-end materials recovery and fuel preparation plant, which opened its doors in September 2017. As well as recovering recyclates the facility prepares the remaining residual waste into a fuel that meets the exact specifications required to ensure a clean and efficient conversion process and to minimise production of ash and other by-products.

We are delighted to announce that Levenseat is now an accredited living wage employer.


What is the real living wage?

In April 2016 the government introduced a higher minimum wage rate for all staff over 25 years of age. However, the government's national living wage is not calculated according to what employees and their families need to live. The real living wage rates are higher because they are independently-calculated based on what people need to get by. By qualifying for this accreditation we are making a commitment to ensuring our employees earn a wage that meets the costs of living, not just the government minimum.

Commenting on the achievement, Angus Hamilton, Managing Director said "We are really proud to be able to make this commitment, which fits with our value of being a great place to work. The Real living wage is the only rate calculated according to costs of living. It provides a voluntary benchmark for employers that wish to ensure their staff earn a wage they can live on, not just the government minimum. We hope our commitment highlights our dedication to encouraging a positive and kindhearted culture for the Levenseat Team."
